

CSIA has strongly established exchange partnerships and regular competitive participation with a number of specialist Science Schools across the globe. Our International Programme is in its 14th year going from strength to strength and proving to be increasingly successful year upon year. We have a combination of exchanges, collaborations and competitions that are attended by students and staff from CSIA.

The International Programme consists of two important elements; students visiting our partner schools (outgoing trips) and students/families acting as hosts when our partner schools visit CSIA (incoming trips).

Incoming Trips

In agreeing to participate in an outgoing trip there is an understanding that you will act as host on the return trip.

In some cases it is possible to host before travelling, which enables your child to be more confident about departing to a foreign country without you.

In some cases, hosting the same nationality student as your child's trip is not possible due to a clash of dates with something you already have planned. If this is the case, please indicate which hosting dates are suitable.

All students participating in an international trip do so on the understanding that they will be asked to contribute to some or all of the research, presentation, public speaking and cultural performance elements of the trip.

The duration of each outgoing trip is approximately ten days, plus travelling time either side of this. Holland is available for Year 9. The rest are open to Year 10 plus.

The dates of the trips are provisional until tickets are booked. There are many factors that affect the dates of these trips.

The cost for each trip is a minimum of £800. The cost of each trip would ideally be payable by the departure time of the visit, or within the academic year that the outgoing trip takes place. Provision is in place for payments to be made by instalments.

Prior to CSIA booking any airfares we need a copy of your child's passport. The passport needs to be valid for six months beyond the end of the return flight to the UK. It is the responsibility of parents/carers to consult your child's doctor for medical advice.









Expectations

Exchange students are ambassadors for our school and will be invited to take part in the Programme with the recommendation of their teachers, Pastoral Support Workers and Key Stage Directors. Participation will involve the students working together as part of a team, possibly researching and completing a presentation along with a cultural performance, dependent on the type of event. Students who would like to participate in an International opportunity should have an interest in Science and a desire to establish global connections for the future. Your child should be confident speaking publicly and be ready to experience and embrace all aspects of foreign culture. In the event of a trip being oversubscribed, we will conduct interviews to determine places.


